FALSE PROPHETS, TRUE PROPHETS

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God's very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God's mouth. In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the authority of God's own voice, the Holy One of God.

The whole history of our church is filled with both true and false prophets. But in today's Gospel we learned that Jesus' fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn't an authority because he was popular or famous. We also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God's purposes. And today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: If we truly listen to God, it will be God's very words filling our mouths.

PERPETUAL ADORATION

(Editor's note. The following is reprinted with permission from the Missionaries of the Blessed Sacrament, P.O. Box 1701, Plattsburgh, NY 12901, and is taken from the prayer book entitled, COME TO ME IN THE BLESSED SACRAMENT.)

Through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we give glory to the Father. Through perpetual exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, we give glory to the Son: "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive honor and glory and peace." (Rev 5:12)

In other words, Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is infinitely deserving of our unceasing adoration in thanksgiving for all He has done for our salvation. This is why perpetual adoration is ongoing in a parish: it lasts as long as Our Lord's love for us in the Blessed Sacrament lasts, which is forever.

As long as He loves us enough to want to be with us day and night, then we want to love Him enough to be with Him day and night. We respond with 'around the clock' perpetual adoration because the Eucharist calls us to be generous with God; for it is the sacrament of God's infinite generosity toward man, and the difference to God between mediocrity and generosity, is the same difference that exists between time and eternity.

Hours of Adoration at St. Frances Cabrini Church are 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. every Friday. If you would like to join the SFXC Adoration program or have any questions about it, please call the parish office at 776-9097. Again, the hours of adoration are from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. every Friday.
